Slips, trips & falls	<ul> <li>Uneven floor surfaces</li> <li>Changes in floor surface</li> <li>Steps</li> <li>Falling from play equipment</li> <li>Falling from vehicles</li> <li>Running</li> <li>Climbing on fences &amp; walls</li> <li>Wet floors</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Changes in floor surface highlighted / painted</li> <li>Edges of steps painted white</li> <li>Good lighting in all areas</li> <li>Sensible footwear recommended on website – no heels</li> <li>Safety surfaces under play equipment – play bark, rubber crumb, honeycomb matting, grass</li> <li>Seat belts &amp; roll bars fitted on barrel rides</li> <li>Customers remain seated on tractor ride</li> <li>Low roofs padded / marked</li> <li>Signage used to identify wet floors</li> </ul>	3	2	6
Collision with vehicles	<ul> <li>In the car park</li> <li>Vehicles on site</li> <li>Unloading / dropping off in inappropriate areas</li> <li>Tractor &amp; barrel rides</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>8 metre, traffic free slope between exit door and car park</li> <li>One way system in place in the car park</li> <li>Speed limits in place across the site</li> <li>Drop off point at front entrance for coaches and taxis</li> <li>Coach parking on the grass by the pond away from main traffic flow</li> <li>Staff in the car park at peak times to direct &amp; monitor parking</li> <li>No vehicles on the farm park during opening hours unless for an essential reason when a member of staff walks in front to clear the route.</li> <li>Strict procedures for accounting for customers on tractor &amp; barrel rides which operate on designated tracks in non-public areas.</li> </ul>	1	4	4

Lost children &	- Unsupervised children - Crowded areas - Children wandering off - Emergency situations	<ul> <li>Parents asked to supervise their children at all times</li> <li>Groups encouraged to have a way of identifying their members – uniform, high vis vests, coloured hats etc</li> <li>Staff on radio and procedures in place to reunite families</li> <li>CCTV covers large areas of the site</li> </ul>	3	1	4
Bacterial contamination	<ul> <li>Poor hand hygiene</li> <li>Eating in animal contact areas</li> <li>Unsupervised children in animal contact areas</li> <li>Contact with animal faeces</li> <li>Customers not aware of the risk of contamination</li> <li>Touching / feeding animals</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Hand wash facilities located around the site with signage about the importance of doing so before eating &amp; after touching animals</li> <li>Information on the risk to health available on the website, in the toilets, at hand wash stations and from staff during animal activities.</li> <li>Cleaning and maintenance schedules in place to control the risk from bacteria</li> <li>Animals not allowed to wander the park</li> <li>Supervised animal handling sessions</li> <li>Clearly separated animal contact and play areas</li> </ul>	3	3	9
Injuries from animal contact	<ul> <li>Poor supervision of animal activities</li> <li>Unsupervised children</li> <li>Ignoring instruction &amp; warning signs on animal pens</li> <li>Feeding animals</li> <li>Eating around animals</li> <li>Entering animal pens &amp; fields</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>All staff fully trained in running animal handling sessions</li> <li>Only good-natured animals used for handing sessions</li> <li>Staff in the animal barn to supervise animals and customers &amp; encourage safe behaviour</li> <li>Animal fields double fenced to restrict access &amp; contact</li> <li>Children to be supervised by their responsible adults at all times</li> <li>Signage up about NOT feeding animals &amp; washing hands before and after doing so.</li> <li>Animal movement around the site restricted when open to allow for animal activities only.</li> <li>1st aiders available on site</li> </ul>	3	4	8

General in Sheep Sheep COVENTURE	- Burns from rope, slides, hot food - Scalds from hot drinks, hot water in taps - Splinters from fencing, wooden play equipment - Contact injuries from general play - Sand in the eyes - Collisions with other children – bumps & bruises	<ul> <li>Long sleeved tops and trousers recommended for play equipment</li> <li>Play equipment with age restrictions clearly labelled</li> <li>Take away cups &amp; lids available for hot drinks</li> <li>Hot water in taps thermostatically controlled to 35-45°C</li> <li>Wood of play equipment treated to remove the risk of splinters</li> <li>Some risk of injury inherent with all play</li> <li>Rules of use displayed at specific play areas</li> <li>Cleaning and maintenance schedules in place to identify and rectify potential hazards</li> <li>Ice packs available for bumps &amp; bruises</li> <li>1st aid available on site</li> <li>Accident reporting and monitoring in progress</li> </ul>	2	2	4
Weather conditions	<ul> <li>Sunburn from hot weather</li> <li>Wet clothing and footwear</li> <li>Crowded indoor areas in wet weather</li> <li>Cold wind</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>- Umbrellas available for picnic tables to give shade</li> <li>- Several buildings available with shade from sun / protection from rain</li> <li>- Picnic areas available under cover</li> <li>- Heated indoor areas available</li> <li>- Limited amount of spare clothing available</li> <li>- Advice on website on appropriate clothing for the site</li> </ul>	2	1	2

Transfer of Sheep of the NTURE	- Close contact with people you don't usually meet or have contact with -Transmission of viruses from person to person in crowded, poorly ventilated areas - Poor hand hygiene - Non consideration of others	<ul> <li>Customers encouraged to book tickets on line in advance to enable us to monitor numbers on site</li> <li>Daily timetable devised to provide activities across the site at a variety of times</li> <li>The majority of activities take place outdoors &amp; in well-ventilated areas.</li> <li>Indoor areas are ventilated as much as possible</li> <li>Customers are asked to be considerate of others and wear face coverings in indoor areas if unwell.</li> <li>Customers are asked not to visit if suffering from Covid or other virus like symptoms.</li> <li>Cleaning regime in place throughout the day &amp; across the site</li> </ul>	3	3	9
